"Seasons of Change"

We sometimes jokingly refer to the four seasons in Florida as Summer, Summer, Still Summer, and Hurricane Season. Well, Welcome to Fall "y'all!" The autumnal equinox arrives on Monday, September 22. With each season there are changes, even if they are more subtle in the Sunshine State. Our lives too are marked by seasons! Life is constantly changing, and we may wonder what season of life we are in or that we are getting ready to go through.

In Acts chapter 8 the early church is going through a season of change. After the martyrdom of Stephen (Acts 7), the forces of hatred were unleashed and a "great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem" (8:1). It was a terrible time as Saul began his campaign of terror rounding up believers seeking to "destroy the church," rooting out Christians going house to house (8:3). We can only imagine the fear and suffering that these nameless saints endured at the hands of Saul and others.

But a "God thing" happened because of this "scattering" of believers. Wherever they went they "preached the word" (8:4). Although persecution brought pressure and change, it also produced "perseverance," "character," "hope" (Rom. 5:3-4), and the spread of the gospel. Change is difficult, uncomfortable, and often unwelcome, but change is necessary for growth and without it, there is stagnation. Think about the possibility and power of change as it relates to the gospel and your spiritual relationship with Christ. Change brings adaptability and builds resilience. The disciples adapted to their new reality and through it they became more resilient. Resilience is the ability to withstand difficulties or adversity, to adapt to changing conditions and recover. Resilience is needed because we are going to face adversity in life.

Change brings new opportunities. Embracing change opens doors to new possibilities and experiences that might not have been considered before. The disciples knew of the great commission, and that they would be witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8), but I don't think they gave it much thought to how all that was going to happen. Well, a season of change made it happen. And because the saints were "scattered" from Jerusalem, they now have a whole new mission field. Change brings new opportunities.

Change brings learning and transformation. Change can often lead us to a deeper understanding of our potential, we see how much more there is of God, we learn more of his character, and we discover that he is still shaping us into his image. Change can be the stimulus to press in close and seek God with all our heart.

What change is occurring in my life? How am I responding to it in positive ways? And what change is needed in my life for me to have a deeper understanding of the character of God and who he has created me to be? And what change is occurring or needed in our fellowship so that we can advance the gospel? Remember, in life adversity can lead to an advance, difficulties can become doors, and change can lead to circumstance for a season of growth and great joy! It's going to be a great Fall "y'all!"
