"A Sign, a Son, and a Savior"

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." Isaiah 7:14. NIV

Isaiah (7:10-16) and Matthew (1:18-25) give us contrasting stories of trust. King Ahaz is called to trust in God during a dark time in Judah's history and Joseph is called to trust in the Lord even though he doesn't understand what God's plan is. With the fear of impending invasion, Ahaz refused a sign, he would trust in himself, in his armies, and in his defenses. But Ahaz would receive a sign whether he wanted one or not, and it would be the sign of a son, Immanuel (7:14). The name Immanuel means "God with us" and this name symbolized God's abiding presence with his people, even in the dark days of crisis between Assyria and Israel. God would not forsake his people, even if their leaders did not lead wisely. The promised son would be a type of the ideal king who would ultimately rule, God incarnate in Jesus, our Immanuel.

Matthew connects the dots of the ancient prophesy and tells us that what was taking place with Mary was to "fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' – which means 'God with us'" (Matt. 1:22-23). While the promise in Isaiah had meaning for his day and time, the promise of God's saving and abiding presence with his people (Immanuel) was uniquely fulfilled in the birth of Jesus, God's Son. Joseph had a difficult time trusting God and for a time, he was planning on walking away from it all! He was on the brink of saying "No!" to God, to Mary, and to his role in the story of the coming Savior. It was while Joseph wrestled with this inner conflict that "an angel of the Lord" appeared to him in a dream, "do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit" (1:20). This settled things for Joseph, and he took Mary home to be his wife (1:24). His fear and doubt gave way to immediate faith and trust. Not fully understanding, he decided to trust in the Lord. And when the child was born, "he gave him the name Jesus" (1:25) which is the Greek form of Joshua meaning, "the Lord saves." Putting the names of Jesus and Immanuel together we have, "God is here and he is here to save!" And isn't that the real meaning of Christmas! The Babe was born in Bethlehem, "veiled in flesh the Godhead see . . . Jesus our Immanuel!" Christmas is about celebrating the Son of God who came to save and who is present with us always.

May this Advent and Christmas season for you and your family be filled with God's love, joy, and peace. And may your celebrations of our Savior bring a deeper awareness of his saving grace, his presence in your life, and the love and joy that Christ desires to bring to our world! As you view this Winter edition of the Good Newsletter aside from our regular schedule of worship and Bible studies you will find seasonal events and activities that represent opportunities for spiritual growth, fellowship, service, and outreach. Pray for people in your life, and for opportunities to invite people to Bible study, or worship, or one of our special Christmas community events. Thank you for your faithfulness to share God's love to our community this Christmas season.


Thank You


Student Christmas Party!

Be in prayer for our students and leaders as they travel to Orlando for an unforgettable, electrifying, and worshipful experience.



Wednesday Night Rehearsals


Reminder: Our music ministry will take a break from rehearsals starting December 17 - 31.



Henry B. Plant Museum is a National Historic Landmark, commemorating its role as a military headquarters during the Spanish-American War. Unlike most museums dedicated to lifestyles of the past, it contains the actual furnishings enjoyed by the first guests to visit here. The Museum accurately reflects the extravagance of the Gilded Age's industrial elite and the vision of shipping and railroad magnate Henry B. Plant. Exhibits, including "Tampa at War" and "Plant's Southern Empire" as well as special collections and programs, are among the museum's offerings.
